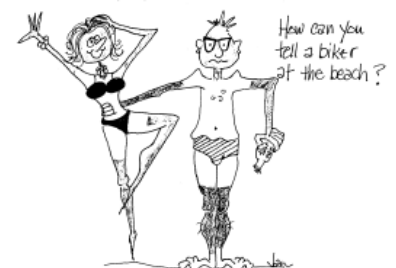

Sixteen MCBC campers traveled to Boulder Junction to again ride the beautiful roads and around the lakes in the pristine and beautiful northwoods of Wisconsin. It was a long trip, but after setting up our campers, tents, etc., and starting our rides, we were again “hooked” and looking forward to the joy of cycling in the area.

Day one took us on a 43-mile trail/road ride; the first half of the ride being on a paved trail beginning in Boulder Junction. The trail took us through the woods, at times over roller coaster hills and around sharp curves, and in and out of the many state parks along the way, ending in Saynor; the second half of the ride took us on the roads through the Star Lake area, ending back in Boulder Junction. ## The Case for Camelbaks

For those riders not familiar with Camelbaks or Camelbak “look a likes, these are small back packs that carry between 50 to 100 ounces of water. They have a tube that makes drinking water extremely easy. I feel they are a necessity when riding with a group or by yourself. Jackie and I have seen too many accidents caused by riders reaching for their water bottle while taking their eyes off the road or riders in front of them. It’s the same safety aspect as changing from up-tube shifters to STI shifters. It only takes a second to look down at the wrong time. It is purely a safety issue.

The second reason is you will drink a lot more water, which keeps you hydrated because it is so convenient. The only minor disadvantage is being on your back. I highly recommend these.

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## What is the procedure when an emergency vehicle approaches?

On a Saturday ride from Veteran's Memorial Park, a group of MCBC riders, myself included, were passed from the rear by an ambulance flashing red lights but not using their siren. We were all off to the side as far as possible but we didn't stop. We later wondered if we should have pulled off the road and stopped in compliance with motor vehicle Rules of the Road.

Both Illinois and Wisconsin Bicycle Laws state:

The bicycle is defined as a vehicle. The operator of a vehicle is granted the same rights and subject to the same duties as the driver of any other vehicle.

Therefore, a bicycle rider should pull off to the side of the road and stop for any emergency vehicle approaching.

### **ROUN'DA MANURE RIDE August 18, 2007**

Didn't get enough ice cream last week or looking for a ride in the pastoral farm area of Southern Wisconsin? The Sharon (WI) Main Street Association is presenting their Roun'da Manure Bicycle Tour on Saturday, August 18, 2007. The ride offers routes of 22, 44 and 64 miles over rural roads. Included are maps and cue sheets and coupons for ice cream or other snacks at locally famous ice cream shops. After the ride, you are invited to a free Pig Roast lunch in Sharon. All of this is preceded by an all you can eat pancake breakfast (donation required). Judging by all the food that is offered, I think we should all sign-up for the 64-mile route!

Registration details: You can register the day of the ride or you can pre-register by July 30<sup>th</sup> and receive a free water bottle. If you register 3 or more riders before July 30<sup>th</sup>, each rider will receive a \$5 discount and a water bottle. Standard registration fee is \$25.

Day of ride registration times are: 44 and 64-mile routes – 7:30 AM – 9:30 AM
